Student Leadership Council 2025-2026 Constitution

The Mission of the Student Leadership Council:

The Eastside Preparatory School Student Leadership Council is a student-run organization committed to enhancing the engagement of our student body and creating unity inside the Upper School. The council will attempt to advocate for the rights and interests of all students within the Eastside Preparatory School community.

Duties and Obligations of the Student Leadership Council:

The Student Leadership Council represents student interests by collaborating with the administration, faculty, and staff. The Student Leadership Council has responsibility in the following areas: The planning and coordination of student events (dances, socials, spirit weeks, EagleCon, etc.), Acting as a communication liaison between the student body and the administration. The Student Leadership Council General Assembly is composed of five elected Chairs and a body of Committee Members. Becoming a Committee Member is open to any student who wishes to join and sign the Constitution.

Events, Student Culture, and Prom Chair Co-Chairs (2):

These two Chairs are responsible for planning homecoming, spirit weeks, winter wars, the winter social, prom, and field day and any other events that develop throughout the year.

These events should be designed to include the whole community and bring everyone together.

To plan events, the Chairs must work with the Student Life Coordinator to schedule and organize the events. Since this is a heavy workload, two people will share the same job, but they are encouraged to divide up the work evenly prior to the start of the academic year.

Sports and Athletics Chair (1):

The goal of this role is to foster an inclusive and supportive sports culture within EPS.

This person will plan fan nights for all sports and work with each individual team to make the event the best possible experience for them. This includes working with the Director of Athletics and other faculty to coordinate times and purchasing of materials for games. Events in the past have included senior nights, faculty vs. student games, and the homecoming game.

Community Outreach Co-Chairs (2):

These roles are designed to make the student leadership council an inclusive and transparent organization. This will be achieved by talking with students outside of the organization, collaborating with other clubs, and advocating for the needs of students. Some tasks include being responsible for setting and tracking regular Town Hall & committee meetings, , taking and tracking meeting notes, and sending out general communications to all teams. Also, this position is responsible for creating a monthly newsletter that will outline the work the Student Leadership Council has done. Develop and track any surveys from SLC and work with GLRs to track and manage Spirit Points. These chairs are responsible for running the @Eastsideprepstudentlife Instagram account. There should be posts from every event as well as posts from other clubs. Content should be monitored and should always be school appropriate. This role is also responsible for creating all advertising for other SLC sponsored events such as posters and assembly announcements.

Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (EICL) Co-Chairs (2):

The goal of these chairs is to amplify student voices to increase equity within the EPS community. The EICL co-chairs will support the efforts of the following clubs: GSA, Q-STEM,

Girls Empowerment, Allies for Equity, APIDA Club, and any future identity-based clubs. They will work directly with Affinity Group leaders in terms of scheduling, representation, and advising. The chairs will serve to represent the interests of these groups to other SLC representatives and the general assembly. The chairs will lead discussions on diversity, equity, and inclusion issues, and brainstorm solutions or action. Finally, the co-chairs will work with the EICL co-coordinators to develop communication and education for cultural and heritage months through assemblies and school-related events.

Fine and Performing Arts Chair (1):

The purpose of this role is to uplift the work and experiences of students in the arts and further integrate all forms of artistic expression (including but not limited to musical, visual, theatric, etc.) within the EPS community. The goal of this work is to create a thriving arts culture at Eastside Prep. The chair member serving in this role will work closely with the F&PA Director and Art Faculty to promote student engagement in the arts by planning assembly announcements and helping coordinate performances, planning support and advertising for events, and curating, as well as assembling visual art displays around campus.
